

the Co-op and her parents were the licensee's of the Sampson and Lion pub. The only other person who I can recall by name from the Mulberry Bush was Stan BODMAN who again was killed in the explosions. As I have already said, I would have known other people from the pub at the time but I cannot recall their names after this length of time.

I knew Clive JONES who was the barman at the time and also the licensee Dave JONES and his wife.

The pub was a nice place to drink at the time and there was a good atmosphere in there and I do not recall there ever being any trouble in there.

When I was in the pub it would have been usual for me to stand at the end of the bar, at the opposite end to the serving hatch. There was a pillar at this location and I used to stand behind this.

I recall that at the time of the bombings I was working the night shift and this entailed starting work at eight twenty pm (2020) and this would have meant finishing about 3 (0300) or 4 (0400) o'clock in the morning. I recall that on the day of the bombings, Thursday 21st November 1974 (211174), it was pay day and I had gone into work early to collect my wage packet. At work I met up with Trevor THRUPP, who had just finished work. He said that he was going to the Mulberry
