"On Thursday, 21st November, 1974, I was on duty at the General Hospital, Birmingham.

At about 9.00 p.m. that evening I went to Casualty Department to assist in the treatment of major injuries resulting from the bombings.

At about 9.05 p.m. I saw Michael William BEASLEY who was suffering with extensive injuries. An attempt was being made to resuscitate the man but in view of the extensive injuries, bi-lateral traumatic amputation of both legs and left arm with extensive burns to face and right arm, further continuation of resuscitation was not likely to be successful. On this basis I instructed that resuscitation attempts should cease and certified the patient as dead."
