"I am a married man and I live at the above address with my family. Maxine HAMBLETON was my eldest daughter and she was born on 6th July, 1956, in Birmingham. At the time of her death she was studying for another two 'A'-levels, as a student at home.

She was a healthy and industrial girl and was leading a very full life.

On Thursday, 21st November, 1974, Maxine left the house at about 7.50 p.m. in order to meet some friends in town, one of them being Jane DAVIES of **DPA** and another being Marilyn Paula NASH **DPA**. That was the last time I saw Maxine alive.

On Thursday, 28th November, 1974, in the morning, I attended the Central Mortuary in Newton Street, Birmingham, where I identified the body of my daughter in the presence of Dr. GRIFFITHS the Home Office Pathologist and an Ambulance driver, Mr. Michael PACKER and Dr. PATERSON."
