Birmingham on the 24th May, 1957. I was at home on Thursday the 21st November, 1974. Jane left home at about 8pm. She was going to meet some friends in Birmingham Town Centre (Including Maxine HANBLETON) On Friday 22nd November (Page 1...)

1974 I went to the City Mortuary in Newton Street and there identified the body of my daughter Jane Elizabeth Davis to Peter Wool Goodship. Dr. Patterson.

On Thursday the 28th November, 1974 I went to Digbeth Police Station and Identified a Brown leather handbag contained a bank book in the name of Jane Elizabeth Davis and other personal items. I also identified a large number of photographs and negatives and a plastic bag containing a school book and other personal papers. All of this property belonged to Jane.
